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Lesson 21: Futhatayn (Two Futha's)

Part I: What You Need to Know

Look at these letters do you notice anything unusual about their Futha's?



Am I seeing double or are there **TWO** Futha's on top of that letter?

You've done it again! Paying attention to everything you see in the Qur'an and asking questions will help you learn all of the rules in no time! That sign is called **Fut-ha-tayn** or **Futha Tan-ween**. And its really two Futha's on top of each other (Futhatayn in Arabic just means 2 Futha's). You can think of Futhatayn as **twin** Futha's, they have a lot in common, but they are not the same; still you often see them together. When you see a Futhatayn instead of saying "aa" like regular Futha, you say "**un**". Take a look at the examples below. Color in each letter with your color pencils as you sound it out.

Remember these signs (known as Harakaat or Tashkeel) help us to recite the Qur'an correctly by showing us what each letter should sound like. Just like the signs we see on the road that tell us which way to go, the signs in the Qur'an tell us how to read each word correctly.

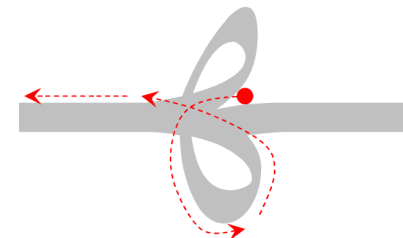
